



Ubykh is just one of the languages that die out every year. This happens because languages are living things. About 6,000 languages exist in the world today, the number of **which**, however, is getting smaller all the time due to the steady growth of bigger languages. Currently, the Celtic languages such as Irish and Welsh are nearly extinct. What's to blame? English. And in South America, Spanish and Portuguese are replacing other regional languages found there.

Linguists predict that at least half of the world's languages will become extinct in the next hundred years. The world's most dominant languages such as English, Mandarin, and Spanish are growing at an amazing speed. But is this necessarily a bad thing? Wouldn't it be

better if we all spoke the same language?

The death of a language is never a good thing. Languages are not simply words which confuse people who speak different tongues. Instead, they are connected to the culture in which they are created. As different cultures experience the world in different ways, their languages reflect this. Therefore, when we lose a language, we lose that bit of knowledge that is connected to it.

Although it would be convenient to be able to express oneself anywhere in the world, it would come at a great loss. If some day we end up speaking the same language, we can be assured that a huge amount of wisdom will be lost.

<2> Jellyfish are neither fish nor made of jelly. In fact, their bodies are made up of 95% water and 5% solid matter. They have been existing for at least half a billion years; therefore, they are older than dinosaurs. Surprisingly, they lack many organs, such as brains, hearts, or lungs. You may be curious about how they can survive without these important organs, but

everything is for the best. They don't have lungs because they rely on thin skin to absorb oxygen. They don't need a heart to pump blood because they don't have any. And they don't need a brain since they have a nerve net—below their outer skin. They can respond to the changes in the environment by using signals from the nerve net.

Most jellyfish are umbrella-shaped and have tentacles. Some even have very long tentacles. However, they never get tangled up or sting themselves because the tentacles are very slippery and will only sting other creatures. Besides, most jellyfish have little or no vision, but they can detect light and ocean currents, which helps them to navigate. A few species can also recognize colors and have a 360-degree view of their environment.

Sizes can be various among Jellyfish, from 0.5 millimeters to the giant Nomura's jellyfish, which can be measured up to two meters in diameter and weigh over 200 kilograms. Though jellyfish are fascinating, they can also be risky. Some jellyfish toxins can be deadly to humans, such as the box jellyfish and the Australian Irukandji. However, deaths rarely happen according to the number of jellyfish-sting victims every year. In any case, it's better to stay out of any jellyfish you may see. You can dive into the ocean to embrace the marine world, but you had better think twice before swimming with jellyfish.
