Stonehenge is a mysterious place that dates back to ancient times. It is known to be about five thousand years old. No one knows who put up the huge stones, and no one knows for sure why Stonehenge was built. The mystery of Stonehenge, however, interests many modern people, and some of them have unusual theories.

Some people say it was a graveyard because some remains of ancient people were found under the ground nearby.

Some people think it to be a calendar used by ancient people. At dawn on Midsummer's Day, if it isn't too cloudy, the sun shines directly through one row of the stones. This fact makes people know that the ancient people who built Stonehenge must have had a deep knowledge of the sun's movement.

The strangest beliefs belong to those who say the stones were put in place by intelligent aliens. However, they disagree about the aliens' reasons for building Stonehenge. Some call it a landing site for alien spaceships and claim to have seen UFOs in the area. Others say it has some kind of magnetic power that was used by aliens for unknown purposes.

<2> English entrance exam in South Korea has been described "super crazy and challenging" by many English-speaking foreigners because it uses a lot of difficult words. But some people argue that people get high scores in that test doesn't prove his or her comprehensive English ability. What goes wrong?

South Korean start learning English as early as when they are in kindergarten. Parents are willing to spend money on private English education for their children. And many high-school students are able to memorize thousands of difficult words and phrases in preparation for their college exam, known as 'Suneung.'

But when it comes to speaking ability in the real life, these young people's tongues **get tangled** after "hello". It's exactly the serious issue faced by South Korea's English education system--- too much emphasis on grammar and vocabulary, which produces students who may be able to read and write but not speak the language.

There are several reasons to explain this situation. First, since middle school, students have taken the similar test format as the entrance exam. Thus, they have probably learnt several tricks on how to pick up the right answer. Besides, few speaking classes are offered during their studying journey. These problems are responsible for their lacking English speaking ability.

<3> Many people think the Nintendo (任天堂) Company originated around 1983, but actually, the Japanese company started in 1889. The company's first product, handmade playing cards, was very popular. Nintendo soon led the market in playing cards after beginning to produce plastic cards in 1953. But a 1956 trip to the U.S. convinced the CEO that there wasn't much room for growth in that market, so he began experimenting with other projects, including toy-making. Indeed, the card market began smaller around 1962, and the company tried hard to stay in business.

A wise decision in 1965 to invent mechanical toys helped turn things around for Nintendo. After the company produced and marketed *Ultra Hand*, they sold over one million units within the first year. They went on to create many electronic toys that helped the company get out of its debt and start making money again.

Nintendo's *Super Mario Brothers* in 1985 became a great success. Nearly 62 million units of them were sold worldwide. Success came again in 1989 with another creation, *Game Boy*, which still ranks as the all-time best-selling portable game system. Nintendo 64 (N64) was released in 1996, selling nearly 33 million units, and receiving *Time* magazine's Machine of the Year award. In 2006, the company launched its Wii, which became another huge success. Nintendo successfully looked to a new market: children and people who had never played video games before. Wii's interactive games, including animated games for kids and sports for the older crowd, offered an all new way to play.

Over the years, the company has faced growing competition and got skeptical remarks about its future. However, Nintendo is still looking forward, making everyone wonder what amazing devices the company will create in the coming years.
